As I sit here today, the former pastor of Malibu Pacific Church, my heart breaks for the beautiful communities of Pacific Palisades and Malibu. Having lived there for 20 years, raising three wonderful children amidst the serene landscapes and the warm embrace of this close-knit community, I am deeply saddened by the recent devastating fires that have ravaged these beloved neighborhoods. The memories of picnics on the beach, hikes up the canyons, mountain biking through the hills, ball games and Easter services on the Bluffs, and gatherings with friends and family are etched in my heart. The sight of the charred remains of homes and the dislocation of so many dear friends is an unbearable pain. The loss of homes is not just the loss of physical structures, but the loss of sanctuaries filled with cherished moments, laughter, and love. The sense of community, which has always been the strength of these communities, now faces the challenge of displacement and uncertainty. After the Woolsey fire, my children experienced the sadness of seeing some classmates relocate permanently. In these trying times, I call upon all of us to unite in prayer and support for these neighborhoods who have lost so much. Let us bow our heads and lift our spirits in a collective embrace of compassion, hope, and determination.
